

Where to Stay and Things to Do in Prince George

If you are traveling to Prince George and are unfamiliar with the area, here are a few suggestions to make your stay enjoyable.

Prince George Airport (YXS) – Shuttles and taxis are available to bring you to and from the airport to downtown Prince George. It's about a 15-20 minute drive.

The Prince George Visitor Information Centre. Currently closed while relocating to new space near the Civic Centre. Check website above for updates on that. If you love to collect colorful tourism brochures and magazines to bring home and stuff in a drawer this is the place for you.

<u>The Exploration Place Museum and Science Centre</u> is a wonderful experience for all ages containing exhibits outlining the history of Prince George. It has an excellent collection of stuffed wildlife if you are a fan of that. Walkable from downtown. Allow 1.5-2 hours.

<u>Caledonia Nordic Ski Club</u> is a first-class Nordic ski and biathlon centre with 55 km of groomed trails and 10 km of night skiing. The club hosts events up to national level races. Gear rental onsite. About a 20-minute drive from town. 8141 Otway Road
